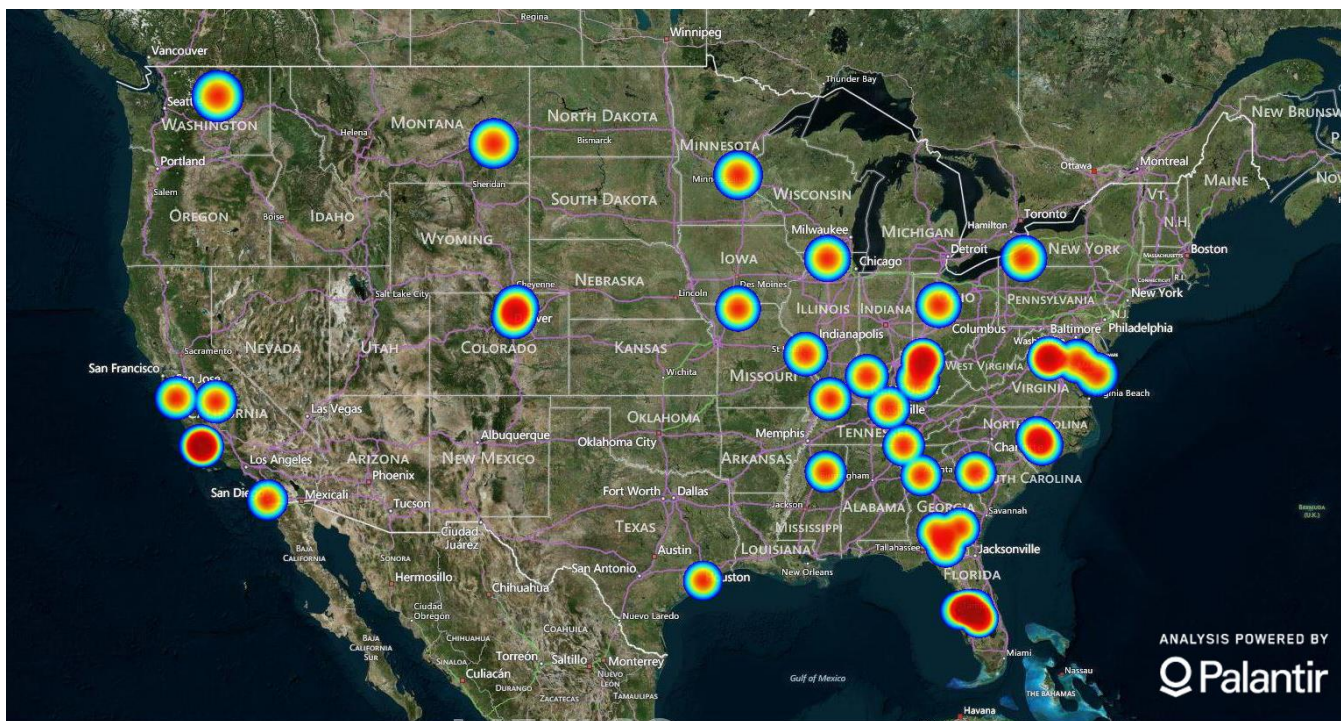


NATIONAL HUMAN TRAFFICKING RESOURCE CENTER (NHTRC) DATA BREAKDOWN
Labor Trafficking in the Agricultural and Animal Husbandry Industries
1/1/2014-12/31/2014

Between 1/1/2014 and 12/31/2014, the NHTRC hotline received reports of 5,042 potential human trafficking cases believed to be occurring in the United States, of which 818 involved labor trafficking. **70 cases** (8.6% of labor trafficking cases) involved labor trafficking in the agriculture and animal husbandry industries. The following report is based on these cases.
